### PLANNING TO GRADUATE?

Chestnut Hill College School of Graduate Studies confers degrees three times per year. Students completing their requirements in the summer and fall semesters may receive their diplomas in August and December respectively. Students completing requirements in the spring semester will receive their diplomas in May. Students completing requirements at any time during the year prior to the May graduation date will be invited to participate in Commencement exercises in May. Requirements include submission of an **Application to Request Graduation**, which is available in the Graduate Office and at [CHC.edu](http://CHC.edu); these forms must be completed and returned to the Associate Registrar, School of Graduate Studies by the deadlines listed below. Students failing to meet the deadline may receive their diplomas the following term. All students should contact the Business Office (215-248-7116) concerning financial status.

<sup>1</sup>The cost of Montessori non-credit options varies according to the length of the course. A 12-hour course costs \$200; a 24-hour course, \$400; a 36-hour course, \$600.00. Montessori credit courses are the same cost as Education.

<sup>2</sup>This fee, charged to students who initiate a drop/add request, is due upon submission of the drop/add request. The change of registration information must be submitted in writing. The effective date of a course change or a withdrawal is the date the written notification is received by the Graduate Registrar. Please refer to the current Graduate Catalog for the Withdrawal Refund Policy.

<sup>3</sup>The Deferred Payment Plan consists of two (2) or three (3) payments per semester. All fees and first tuition payment are due at time of registration.
