

If you're entering as a first-year student, please submit your official high school transcripts. Standardized test scores (SAT and/or ACT) are optional. If you are transferring, please send official transcripts from all colleges or universities attended. If you have not completed a minimum of 12 credits, your official high school transcripts and test scores will also be required.

♂ Submit enrollment deposit

Upon your acceptance, you may enroll by submitting \$500 for a residential deposit or \$300 for a commuter deposit to reserve your spot as a member of the incoming class. Deposits are non-refundable after May 1.





Chestnut Hill College is committed to ensuring affordability and accessibility to all our students.

As such, we offer generous merit awards and scholarship opportunities, earning the average first-year student MORE THAN \$15,000 a year in merit-based scholarships.



Merit-based scholarships are offered at the time of acceptance and are based on high school GPA, standardized test scores, or college GPA (if transferring).

Submit your FAFSA to determine if you're eligible to receive any additional state, federal, or institutional grants or scholarships.



TICHENOR-GREER SCHOLARS PROGRAM

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) majors are invited to apply for the Tichenor-Greer Scholars Program, which awards up to 20 students in each class \$5,000 a year if they remain in good standing, participate in all required activities/service, and maintain a 2.5 GPA or higher.

INTERDISCIPLINARY HONORS PRORAM

The Interdisciplinary Honors Program (IDHP) challenges highly qualified students to pursue a creative approach to the liberal arts. IDHP students are exposed to a variety of cultural attractions and given many opportunities to share research with professors, peers, and the larger academic community.
