

The Location

The University

University College Cork (UCC) is a world-class university founded in 1845. The university combines a rich tradition of teaching, research, and scholarship. UCC is unrivalled in the quality of its academic programs, the beauty of its campus, and its vibrant student life. It boasts an international reputation which draws in 3,000 students from over 100 of the world's countries.

The university is often ranked among the best in the world. UCC supports incoming study abroad students through its well-established programs. It also boasts a number of vibrant clubs and societies that students can enjoy on campus. UCC is

Academics

Student's visiting UCC have a variety of courses to choose from. Housing

Visas

Visiting Students from the US **do not** require a student visa. They are however, required to



register with Immigration in Cork for long term residency. Registration is done after arrival once student has an entry visa.



Air Travel

CHC students are responsible for making their own travel arrangements. Please see the Global Education Office for assistance.

Tuition

CHC students continue to pay CHC tuition and fees while attending University College Cork. Students are billed for tuition and fees plus a Global Education fee. Keep in mind that all financial aid can be applied towards your study in Ireland since you are participating with an official CHC sponsored program. Students do not pay any tuition fees in Ireland. Please note you will pay for your own room and board, any travel, personal expenses, and activities you participate in.



Academic Calendar

The term for the Fall semester begins in September and runs through December. The Spring semester begins in January and runs through May.

Health Insurance

All CHC students are required to maintain health insurance while abroad. All CHC students also **MUST** purchase an ISIC card prior to study abroad. You may find out your current health insurance does not cover travel overseas. Your health insurance carrier must provide written verification of your coverage. The Global Education Office can assist you in purchasing supplemental coverage.
