LICENSURE AND DOCTORAL STUDY

The M.S. degree in Clinical and Counseling Psychology meets the requirements for students seeking Master's licensure in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as either a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (LMFT). Upon degree completion, graduates must accrue 3,000 supervised hours of counseling work. The M.S. degree also provides the training and preparation for students who wish to pursue doctoral study in the field.
